

OCN Website Design and Construction Award

The Webmaster & Webmaestro courses lead to the **OCN Website Design and Construction award**, which consists of 15 Credits, Nine at Level 3 and six at Level 2. The price of the award is included in the course fees.

The award is issued through the **North West Region (ONCNW)** of The National Open College Network who are approved as an awarding body with the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority (QCA).



The **National Open College Network (NOCN)** is the leading credit-based awarding body in the UK, offering high quality, flexible, credit-based qualifications.

The Webmaster course has 6 OCN Credits awarded at Level 2, whilst the Webmaestro course has 9 credits awarded at Level 3.

The Website Design & Construction award consists of all these credits however the level 2 credits or the level 3 credits can be issued as individual qualifications in their own right.

WEBMASTER – (HTML Credits) – “6 Credits at Level 2” awarded for successful completion of the Webmaster assignments.

WEBMAESTRO – (JavaScript) – “6 Credits at Level 3” awarded for successful completion of the Webmaestro assignments.

(Dynamic HTML Credits) – “3 Credit at Level 3” awarded for successful completion of the appropriate Webmaestro assignments.

OCN Credits

Credits are a measure of achievement. One credit is awarded for those learning outcomes which, on average, a learner may reasonably be expected to achieve in a notional 30 hours of learning. Credit value is calculated on the basis of direct contact time and any additional independent study time required to achieve the learning outcomes.

The level describes the process of learning, from the acquisition of basic skills for everyday living at entry level to independent, autonomous learning at level three. The following illustrates the broad equivalencies between Unit levels and other forms of measuring achievement.

LEVEL THREE	Equivalent to 'A' Level, NVO 3, GNVQ Advanced, Access to H.E.
LEVEL TWO	Equivalent to GCSE A- C, NVO 2, GNVQ Intermediate
