On successful completion of the course you will receive a recognised level 3 award (Comparable to working at A Level or NVQ Level 3).

The following topics are covered: What influences biodiversity?; and Why is biodiversity important?.

- **Climate Change**

The following topics are covered: Why is climate change important?, The effects of climate change in the UK; and Can climate change be stopped?

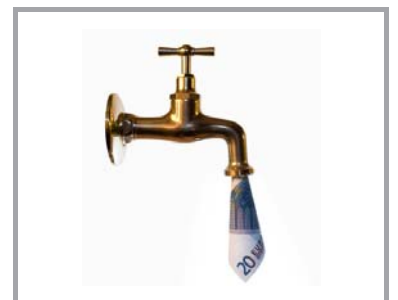
➤ Unit Two – Preserving Environmental Resources

- **Energy**

The following topics are covered: Managing energy; Consequences of not managing energy; and Legislation.

- **Water**

The following topics are covered: Managing the use of water; Consequences of not managing water; and Legislation.

➤ Unit Three – Preserving Environmental Resources

- **Transport**

The following topics are covered: How road transport affects the environment; Managing road transport; Impact of not managing transport; and Legislation.

- **Pollution**

The following topics are covered: Managing pollution; Consequences of not managing pollution; and Legislation.

- **Waste Disposal**

The following topics are covered: Managing waste; Methods of disposing of waste; Impact of not managing waste; and Legislation.

➤ Unit Four – How Do Environmental Issues Affect Businesses?

The following topics are covered: How effective environmental practices can benefit your business.

Pre-Requirements:

There are no particular entry requirements.

Course Duration & Support:

Students may register at any time and have a full year to complete their studies. You also have access to a personal tutor by mail or email for a 12 month period. As the course is self study you can complete in as little or as long a time as you prefer.

Assessment:

You will be assessed on coursework which is detailed in the course materials. Most coursework consists of short paragraph answers to set questions. Your work can be sent back to your course tutor by email or by post.

Qualification:

The award is gained from successfully completed coursework so there is no exam to complete.

On successful completion of this course, students will receive a **Level 3 Managing Environmental Awareness Award**.

This award has been independently accredited at a level of learning equivalent to level 3 on the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) and is comparable to working at A Level or NVQ Level 3.

The award is issued through NCFE. NCFE is recognised as an awarding body by the qualification regulators ('regulators') for England, Wales and Northern Ireland. The regulators are the Office of the Qualifications and Examinations Regulator (Ofqual) in England, the Department for Children, Education, Lifelong Learning and Skills (DCELLS) in Wales and the Council for Curriculum, Examinations and Assessment (CCEA) in Northern Ireland.
